AMENDED EMERGENCY ORDINANCE NO. 20-031

RELATING TO THE 2020 BUDGET; MAKING A SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION IN GRANT CONTROL FUND 130 TO PROVIDE EXPENDITURE AUTHORITY FOR CARES ACT FUNDS

WHEREAS, on January 21, 2020, the Washington State Department of Health confirmed the first reported case of the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) in the United States in Snohomish County, Washington. COVID-19, a respiratory disease that can result in serious illness or death, is caused by the SARS-CoV-2 virus, which is a new strain of coronavirus that had not been previously identified in humans and can easily spread from person to person;

WHEREAS, since January 21, 2020, the disease has spread throughout the United States. On January 31, 2020, the United States Department of Health and Human Services secretary Alex Azar declared a public health emergency for COVID-19, beginning January 27, 2020. On February 29, 2020, Washington State Governor Jay Inslee proclaimed a public health emergency for COVID-19. On March 4, 2020, the Snohomish County Health Officer proclaimed a countywide public health emergency for COVID-19. On March 4, 2020, Executive Dave Somers issued a "Local Proclamation of Emergency Snohomish County" for COVID-19 (the "Emergency"). On March 13, 2020, the President of the United States of America declared COVID-19 a National Emergency;

WHEREAS, throughout March 2020, in order to combat the spread of COVID-19, Governor Jay Inslee increased limitations on public gatherings, encouraged teleworking, closed schools, and ultimately issued the "Stay Home, Stay Healthy" order on March 23, 2020;

WHEREAS, the "Stay Home, Stay Healthy" required that all people in Washington State immediately cease from leaving their home or place of residence except to participate in essential activities or for employment in essential business activities. The 'Stay Home, Stay Healthy" also required all non-essential business operations in Washington State cease operations except for basic minimum operations;

WHEREAS, during the month of March, 12,301 people within Snohomish County lost their jobs, and job losses are expected to increase substantially in April and May of 2020, demonstrating an economic crisis not seen since the Great Depression;

WHEREAS, on March 27, 2020, the United States Congress passed the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act of 2020 ("CARES Act"), providing direct relief to units of local government through the United States Department of Treasury;

WHEREAS, the Department of Treasury has issued guidance to units of local government for the allowable uses of the direct relief funds. Allowable uses include, but are not limited to, expenses related to facilitating compliance with COVID-19-related public health measures; expenses related to the provision of economic support in connection with the COVID-19 public health emergency; and payroll expenses for certain employees whose services are substantially dedicated to mitigating or responding to the COVID-19 public health emergency; and

WHEREAS, the County Council has determined that it is necessary for the support of county government and its existing institutions as well as necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health or safety to appropriate these funds in the speediest manner possible.

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED:

 **Section 1.** The County Council makes the following findings of fact: a supplemental appropriation in the amount of \$143,447,144.00 is necessary in the Grant Control Fund 130 for budget year 2020 to provide expenditure authority for direct aid provided to Snohomish County from the United States Department of Treasury pursuant to Section 5001 of the CARES Act. The CARES Act provides that these funds may only be used to cover costs that 1). are necessary expenditures incurred due to the public health emergency with respect to the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID–19); 2). were not accounted for in the budget most recently approved as of March 27, 2020; and 3). were incurred during the period that begins on March 1, 2020, and ends on December 30, 2020. Further, the United States Department of Treasury has issued guidelines regarding the allowable uses of these funds.

**Section 2.** The unit and allocation detail for the supplemental appropriation described in Section 1 are as follows:

**Section 3.** <u>Uses of Funds.</u> Amounts appropriated by this ordinance shall be used solely for permissible expenditures pursuant to Section 5001 of the CARES Act, as subsequently amended, and pursuant to guidance and FAQs issued by the United States Department of Treasury.

**Section 4.** <u>Unanticipated Funds.</u> The County Council finds that there is a need for such supplemental appropriation authorized by this ordinance because the funds that support them were unanticipated at the time of the adoption of the 2020 budget and have not been previously appropriated. Based on the foregoing, the Council hereby authorizes this appropriation.

**Section 5.** Finding of Emergency and Effective Date. The County Council finds as a fact that this ordinance is necessary for the support of Snohomish County and its existing institutions as well as necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health or safety to allow for the speediest means to appropriate the CARES Act funds. Based on the foregoing, the County Council declares that an emergency exists and that this ordinance shall take effect immediately.

# Section 6. Budget notes and conditions.

### Budget Note:

(1) Council requests reporting on program status. Council directs that there be regular reporting on each program related to COVID-19 response and CARES Act funding. Biweekly and monthly reports may be presented in writing, but must be accompanied by an in-person report at a scheduled Council meeting on at least a quarterly basis. Reports shall include status of programs, amounts expended to date, achievements of programs to date, plans for upcoming programs, and plans to phase out programs as funds expire.

# **Budget Condition:**

(1) Council restricts Nondepartmental usage. Of the funding allocated from the CARES
Act grant, Nondepartmental category, DAC 130 574161564101, Council directs that all
of these funds remain unspent in Nondepartmental unless further appropriated into
other programs, by motion; said motion to be considered by Council during a public
meeting.
