Scope of Work: COVID-19 Refugee and Immigrant Community Health Outreach Worker Support

Subrecipient: Refugee Health Program with the partnership of refugee health screening clinics that serves refugee and immigrant populations in Washington State, including those with limited English proficiency.

Purpose statement: Refugee Health Program will partner with refugee health screening clinics that serve the refugee and immigrant population to build, leverage, and expand infrastructure support for COVID-19 prevention and control among populations that are at higher risk and underserved. Through this partnership, refugee health screening clinics will hire a Community Health Outreach Worker, or a Vaccine Ambassador, that is culturally and linguistically appropriate. These Community Health Outreach Worker's will then be able to provide catered care and outreach to the refugee and immigrant population. This position will advance health equity in local communities and collaboratively work to reduce COVID-19 related health disparities, increase uptake of COVID-19 and other ACIP recommended vaccines, provide health education, and health related care coordination to address co-morbidities that may lead to severe illness and/death due to COVID-19.

Budget: Up to \$100,000 per year per clinic.
