RESOLUTION NUMBER: 18-27

RESOLUTION SUBJECT: ADOPTION OF THE 2019 BUDGET

WHEREAS, the 2019 Snohomish Health District Budget reflects revenues and expenditures that support public health services throughout Snohomish County; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Health has adopted operating guidelines (Resolution 11-36) that provide for it to approve total and program staffing levels and agency fee schedules; and

WHEREAS, the total budgeted positions in 2019 are 125.9 full-time equivalents (FTE), representing an decrease of 11.8 FTE from the approved FTE in 2018; and

WHEREAS, all union and non-represented regular employees except the administrator will receive a cost of living adjustment (COLA) to final year 2018 salaries and wages, reflecting an increase consistent with final bargaining agreements; and

WHEREAS, the Snohomish Health District's Rucker Building Task Force has identified needed health and safety assessment and repairs; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Health hereby authorizes one-time funding in the amount of \$500,000 for the 2019 Capital Budget from the Snohomish Health District's unreserved fund balance for identified assessment and repairs to the Rucker Building;

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority granted to the Snohomish Health District Board of Health in RCW 70.46 and in the Charter of Snohomish Health District, **subject to the following conditions**, the Board does hereby adopt the 2019 Snohomish Health District Budget as presented on December 11, 2018, and as attached in Exhibit A.

- That until the Board of Health directs otherwise, there shall be a moratoria on all out of state travel by Health District employees with the exception of those required by grants or contracts or otherwise approved by the Executive Committee
- 2. That during the first six months of 2019 there be a financial performance audit the scope of which is approved by the Board of Health
- 3. That during the first six months of 2019 a new format for the budget be developed that contains more detail, explanation of programs and expenditures and which contains significantly fewer references to "miscellaneous" expenditures
- 4. That in the first three months of 2019 there is developed a budget calendar process that can be applied and used in developing the 2020 budget and budgets in the years following 2020
- 5. That the adoption of this 2019 budget be subject to amendment in 2020 as the Board of Health directs
- 6. That there be no hiring of additional employees in 2019 without the review and approval of the Executive Committee and the Board of Health.
