- District cannot dissolve until Department has its own code.






How are we making this new code?








Work Plan for Phase 2

Ch. 2.65 was redundant to our right of appeals located under Title 1 and also omitted specific rights identified in RCW 64.44 and WAC 246-205. New code on appeals is in line with current RCW's and WAC's. New location of appeals language is better organized and easier to read.
