III. Food Safety	 Adopting WAC 246-215, Food Service by reference. This is also known as the Washington State Retail Food Code Removing Ch.2.40, Enforcement Procedures of the Food Program Removing Ch. 2.45, Food Services Manager 	 WAC 246-215, Food Service recently underwent an extensive revision and update (went into effect 3/01/2022). Ch.2.40 is mostly covered under WAC 246-215 and in Title 1 of this Code. We no longer teach Food Safety Mgr. courses as it was resource intensive and financially unsustainable. There are online options available.

	Water Recreation Facilities	 Cleaned up language for easier interpretation 	 Some sections were difficult to read and interpret without going back and referencing the title of each section.
		 Added reference to Certified Pool Operator (CPO) in mandatory trainings 	 Certified Pool Operator (CPO) is the nationwide industry standard for training on basic pool operation.
	Drinking Water	 Merging Ch.4.30 (Supplemental Drinking Water Policies & Procedures for IWS's) with Ch.4.25 (Drinking Water Rules & Regulations) 	 Chapter 4.30 are supplemental procedures to Ch.4.25 (Drinking Water Regulations). Having these two chapters separated adds no value. This will eliminate circular references and redundancies.

Resident Owner Application For a Repair Permit (Ch. 5.35)	Removing entire chapter from Code	 This previously allowed staff to assist in the design of some repair applications. Resource intensive service. Discontinued in 2017 due to liability concern and being financially unsustainable. BOH removed this fee from fee schedule in 2017.

Code Changes: Title 5 (Wastewater)

Chapters	Proposed Changes	Reason for Proposed Changes
On-site Sewage Disposal System Installer Certification Program and Installation Requirements (Ch. 5.40)	 Merged with Ch. 5.45. Created new sections (not new Code) to accommodate sections from Ch. 5.45. 	 Ch. 5.40's "procedures" reference Ch. 5.45 in its entirety. Ch.5.45 was adopted after Ch. 5.40 and should have been folded into Ch.5.40 instead of being a stand alone policy.
Supplemental On-Site Sewage System Installer Certification and Installation Requirements (Ch. 5.45)	 Merged into Ch. 5.40, and deleted remaining redundant portions. 	 Ch. 5.45 are supplemental procedures for Ch. 5.40 Having this as a separate chapter adds no value to the Code.

Chapters	Proposed Changes	Reason for Proposed Changes
On-site Sewage System Monitoring & Maintenance Specialist Certification Program (Ch. 5.70)	 Merged together sections with this Chapter. Deleted redundant sections. 	 The final sections (5.70.110-180) of this Chapter were supplemental procedures adopted by the BOH in 2012. They were added at the back end of this Chapter instead of folded into the existing, applicable sections. For example, this Chapter had two sections for: definitions, purpose, and individual certification requirements.
