 Ch. 1.05 General and Enforcement Provisions Previously titled "Applicability and Definitions. 	General • Renamed chapter.	This new chapter name better describes the content/theme of the code language contained within.
	 1.05.050 Fee Schedules Removing this section and creating a new chapter for fees (see Ch.1.40 on next slide). 	 Due to the amount of fee schedules that will be adopted, the fee schedules will now be easier to reference and locate if they are in their own chapter of the Code.

Ch. 1.30 Official Newspaper of Record	 Identifying the Daily Herald as the official newspaper of record. 	 The Everett Herald (previous newspaper of record) is now called the Daily Herald.
Ch. 1.40 Fees	 Created new chapter to accommodate all fee schedules and code language around fee administration. 	 Isolating each fee schedule into its own section of a chapter will make it easier to revise individually. More user friendly. Easier to cross reference this chapter and its sections in other parts of the Code.

Ch. 4.15 Water Recreation Facility Enforcement Procedures	 General Removed a "code reviser's note" that adopted a DOH guidance document by reference. 	 It's redundant to codify a guidance document that's already referencing a WAC that we have codified.
	 4.15.070 Revocation of permit(s) Cleaned up language regarding the revocation process. 	 Revocation of permits are determined by an administrative review and not a hearing. Clarified that the permit holder still has appeal rights identified in Title 1.

This regulation has been in effect for longer than 12 months and can now be deleted.
