Community Transit	Board members who are full time elected officials receiving full-time compensation in their jurisdictions do not receive per diem, only travel expense reimbursement (currently 0.58/mile). Board members who are part-time electeds receive \$90 per day per RCW 36.57A.050. (amount approved via Board resolution.) It's a per-day rate and includes a full day, portion of a day, event attendance, and call-in scenarios. Per RCW they can be paid up to 75 meetings per year (the chair can be paid up to 100), but they tend to be paid for 2-3 meetings per month and normally don't reach the maximum.
	\$90 per meeting for part-time electeds only – in-person or over the phone; fulltime electeds receive mileage reimbursement only
Grant County Public Health	Some Board members are paid for travel expenses if they travel to the Board meeting from outside the Ephrata area. The Board is comprised of three county commissioners and five city elected officials.
	Not paid; some travel expenses allowed
Kitsap Public Health District	They don't pay their Board members because they're all elected officials (main reason) and the meetings are held during regular business hours. In their roles as elected officials, five are fulltime, one is part-time but works fulltime, and one is part-time.

Seattle-King County Public Health	The Board is not paid. The agency only pays for their parking. The Board consists of three health professionals and eight elected officials.
	Not paid
Spokane Regional Health District	Board members are paid only for travel expenses if they travel on behalf of the district (which is rare). The board is compromised of the three county commissioners, three Spokane city councilmembers, two Spokane Valley councilmembers, one elected official representing small cities, and three commissionerappointed members. The elected officials serve on the board as part of their commissioner/councilmember assigned committee duties, and the appointed members are volunteers.
	Not paid; some travel expenses allowed
Tacoma-Pierce County Public Health	The Board consists of five electeds and three alternate electeds, plus one member from the Pierce Co. Medical Society and one alternate. Per Resolution No. R2006-30 II. E. Compensation, and Rules of Procedure of the Tacoma-Pierce County Board of Health 5. G., Board members or acting alternates that are not full-time electeds receive \$75 per Board meeting, if payment is requested. They are not paid for ad hoc or task force meetings. Part-time electeds are paid \$75 for full Board meetings only
